

THE 1987 CONVENTION OF

The convention was called to order by Chair Mark Hinkle. There were 78 delegates in various stages of being credentialled.

The minutes of the previous Convention were approved, sight unseen.

The motion "to accept those delegates who were not yet credentialled due to the failure of their Chairs to provide written notice to the Secretary 14 days prior to the Convention" PASSED.

Treasurer's Report (Jerry Douglas)
