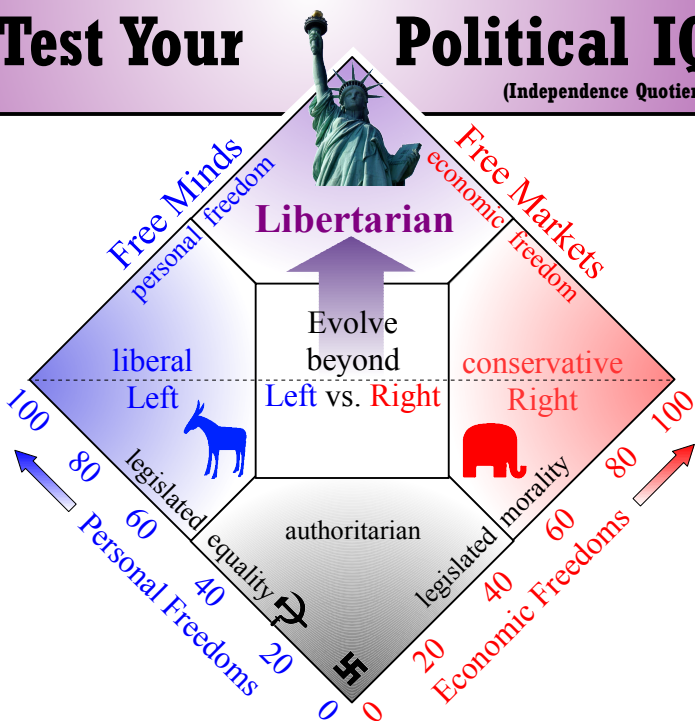

## Are You Tolerant Of Minorities?

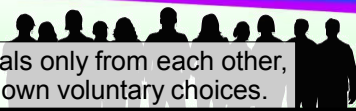
The smallest minority is the individual. Those who tolerate the majority's limits on individual freedom cannot claim to be tolerant of minorities.

**How much personal and economic freedom can you tolerate?**

## Pocket U.S. Constitution

Defend it from our politicians, or it won't defend us from them.

### Your Constitutional Rights

1. Freedom of religion, speech, press, assembly, petition.
2. Right to keep and bear arms.
3. No quartering soldiers in peacetime.
4. No unreasonable searches and seizures.
5. No double jeopardy or self-incrimination. No depriving of life, liberty, or property without due process of law. No taking private property without just compensation.
6. Right to speedy public trial by impartial jury, to confront and subpoena witnesses, and to assistance of counsel.
7. Right of trial by jury in civil lawsuits.
8. No cruel and unusual punishments, no excessive bail or fines.
9. **The enumeration in the Constitution, of certain rights, shall not be construed to deny or disparage others retained by the people.**
10. **The powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution, nor prohibited by it to the states, are reserved to the states respectively, or to the people.**
13. No slavery or involuntary servitude.
14. No depriving of life, liberty, or property without due process of law; no denying any person the equal protection of the laws.
15. Right to vote regardless of race.
19. Right to vote regardless of sex.
24. Right to vote without paying tax.
26. Right to vote at 18 years of age.

### Congress's Only Powers

- §8: Congress shall have power to
1. lay and collect taxes, and duties, imposts, excises that are uniform throughout the U.S.
  2. borrow money on the credit of the United States
  3. regulate commerce with foreign nations and among the states
  4. establish uniform rules on naturalization and bankruptcies
  5. coin money, regulate the value thereof, and fix the standard of weights and measures
  6. punish counterfeiting of the currency of the U.S.
  7. establish post offices and post roads
  8. regulate patents and copyright
  9. establish federal courts
  10. enforce the law of nations
  11. declare war
  12. raise armies, but no appropriation for more than 2 years
  13. provide and maintain a navy
  14. make rules for the military
  15. call forth the militia to execute the laws, suppress insurrections and repel invasions
  16. organize and arm the militia, but let states appoint its officers
  17. govern D.C. and federal land
  18. make all laws necessary and proper for execution of the foregoing powers.
- Amendment 16: Congress shall have power to lay and collect taxes on incomes.
