#### Your Constitutional Rights

- Freedom of religion, speech, press, assembly, petition.
- Right to keep and bear arms. No quartering soldiers in peacetime.
- No
- unreasonable searches seizures.
- double jeopardy or incrimination. No depriving of life, liberty, or property without due process of law. No taking private property without just compensation.
- Right to speedy public trial by impartial jury, to confront and subpoena witnesses, and to assistance of counsel.
- Right of trial by jury in civil lawsuits.
- No cruel and unusual punishments, no excessive bail or fines.
- The enumeration the Constitution, of certain rights, shall not be construed to deny or disparage others retained by the
- people. 10. The powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution, nor prohibited by it to the states, to reserved respectively, or to the people.
- 13. No slavery or involuntary servitude.
- 14. No depriving of life, liberty, or property without due process of law; no denying any person the equal protection of the laws.
- Right to vote regardless of race.
- Right to vote regardless of sex.
- 24. Right to vote without paying tax. 26. Right to vote at 18 years of age.

#### Congress's Only Powers

I§8: Congress shall have power to

Pro-Choice on Everything.

- lay and collect taxes, and duties, imposts, excises that are uniform throughout the U.S.
- borrow money on the credit of the United States
- regulate commerce with foreign nations and among the states
- establish uniform rules naturalization and bankruptcies
- coin money, regulate the value thereof, and fix the standard of weights and measures
- punish counterfeiting of the currency of the U.S.
- establish post offices and post roads
- 8 regulate patents and copyright
- establish federal courts 10. enforce the law of nations
- 11. declare war
- 12. raise armies, but no appropriation for more than 2 years
- provide and maintain a navy
- make rules for the military
- 15. call forth the militia to execute the laws, suppress insurrections and repel invasions
- 16. organize and arm the militia, but let states appoint its officers
- 17. govern D.C. and federal land
- 18. make all laws necessary and proper for execution of the foregoing powers.

Amendment 16: Congress shall have power to lay and collect taxes on incomes.
