## Dissent in 2011 LPOR case

I do not agree with the majority that the government is the default arbiter of what entity in a state is the Libertarian Party of that state.

The majority's ruling means that inertia in record-keeping by the government can trump the operation of the bylaws that Libertarians voluntarily agree to. The Oregon SoS already wrote: "we are unable to process any changes without written approval from the current chair of record of the Libertarian Party of Oregon". The dead hand of an Oregon government webmaster will now control LNC affiliation in Oregon.

The Libertarian Party Platform asserts that political parties are "private voluntary groups" that "should be allowed to establish their own rules". The government might currently impose on us the rules of its game, but we should at least demand to decide who our team is.

## Ruling on 2012 registration fees

Bylaw 11.3.a distinguishes between "accreditation" and "registration": "delegates shall be those so accredited who have registered at the Convention." The Bylaws thus mention "registration" but do not describe it. Robert's describes "registration" and says it "normally" includes "paying the registration fee."

If an implementation of registration is reasonable (e.g. signing in, paying a cost-sharing fee, getting a photo badge), then an affiliate's autonomy is not abridged just because some of their delegates decide not to comply with the registration process. Robert's Rules does not preclude charging some members for activities that not all members undertake.

Some argue that not having a registration fee is a custom that has now become binding. In the absence of reliable evidence about this alleged custom, the Party of Principle should be governed not by lore but by the text of its rules.
